**Review written by Sir Adrian Cadbury**, who in 1992 gave the world its first code on corporate governance, was born in 1929; studied at Cambridge; joined the Cadbury business in 1952; became Chairman of Cadbury Limited in 1965 and retired as Chairman of Cadbury Schweppes in 1989. Sir Adrian was Chairman of the UK Committee on Financial Aspects of Corporate Governance which published its Report and Code of Best Practices in December 1992. He received the International Corporate Governance Network Award in 2001. His book, ‘Corporate Governance and Chairmanship-A Personal View’ was published by Oxford University Press in October 2002 and has been translated into Japanese, Chinese and Italian. In 2005 he was awarded the Laureate Medal for Corporate Governance.



*A particular value of **Corporate Governance, Business Ethics and CSR** lies in its clarity, its international scope and its comprehensiveness. It pulls together the different strands of the study of governance and explains why governance has both broadened in its scope and increased in its importance. 
